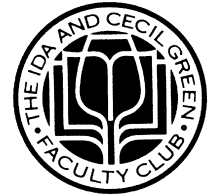

## Recipe from Chef Ed

**Quinoa** (*KEEN-wah*) Dry quinoa looks a bit like sesame seeds but when cooked it becomes fluffy with a hint of crunch, making it an excellent substitution for rice, cous cous, and pasta. Quinoa's major claim to food fame, however, is what *RealAge* researchers call its "nutritional profile." A cup of quinoa has more protein than a quarter-pound hamburger and more calcium than a quart of milk. Yowza. It's also loaded with iron, magnesium, and a bevy of other minerals and B vitamins. No wonder the Incas named it "the mother grain." Try it in this warm winter salad from our friends at *Eating Well*.



### Quinoa and Black Beans

*Stir in your favorite jarred salsa for extra zing.*

*This is also good the next day for lunch.*

Makes 2 servings, about 1/2 cup each

- 1 teaspoon canola oil
- 1/2 bell pepper, chopped
- 2 tablespoons chopped red onion
- 1/2 cup canned black beans, rinsed
- 2 tablespoons broth (or water)
- 1/2 cup hot quinoa (cook according to package directions)

Heat oil in a small saucepan over medium heat. Add bell pepper and onion and cook until almost tender. Add beans and broth (or water) to the pan. Cook until heated through. Stir in quinoa.

## Tribute to Don Tuzin

## DATES TO REMEMBER

Donald Francis Tuzin, 62, professor of anthropology at UCSD, and former chair of the campus Academic Senate, died April 15 at Thornton Hospital of pulmonary hypertension.

He was a member of the University House Task Force and the Friends of the UCSD Libraries Board of Directors.” During UC President Emeritus Richard Atkinson’s tenure as UCSD Chancellor, Tuzin served as associate chancellor, 1990-1993. He was also a long time member of the Club’s Board of Directors.

Chancellor Marye Anne Fox noted that “Don was a valued faculty member and leader of the UCSD community and his contributions, both in and out of the classroom, touched many.

"Don cared deeply about UCSD. He poured energy and time into his role as a Director of the Faculty Club. He worked tirelessly as Chair of the Academic Senate. He was a trusted advisor to several Chancellors. He was a wise and altruistic mentor to countless students and faculty colleagues. He was never too busy to listen and help." said Faculty Club Board Member Richard Somerville.

Born in Chicago, Tuzin graduated from Western Reserve University, received his master’s degree at Case-Western Reserve, and his Ph.D. in anthropology from the Australian National University, Research School of Pacific Studies. He joined the UC San Diego Department of Anthropology in 1973.

As a social anthropologist, Tuzin was one of the world’s top authorities on Melanesian culture, and was co-founder and honorary

curator of UCSD’s Melanesian Archive, the world’s leading depository of unpublished materials on the societies and cultures of Melanesia. The author of four books and many articles, Tuzin’s interests ranged across aspects of social and ritual organization, sexuality and gender, sensory experiences, art, epistemology, and the history of anthropology.

Faculty Club Vice President, Alain J.-J. Cohen said: "Don was the most refined scholar, the ideal colleague and friend, a Renaissance man full of passionate quests and curiosity. He was also a marvelous raconteur:

He delighted his listeners with captivating narratives, in which he would intertwine seamlessly science and the art of life, going back and forth between the story and its mind models - and he'd laugh with you at both the story and the theory."

“Don was a great dear friend. He liked to refer to the Club as his "living room on campus". Don was the founding voice of our new campus tradition, a Newly Tenured Faculty Lunch held each year to recognize this accomplishment of young faculty. His friendship, advice and council will be greatly missed. The Club will never be the same without him.” said Faculty Club President Sally Ashburn.

Survivors include his wife, Beverly Jay Tuzin, and sons, Gregory Francis Tuzin and Alexander Hilary Tuzin. Donations may be sent to the Donald F.
