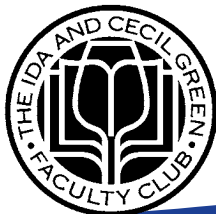

### A Textual Journey with Marjorie Rubenson and Sue Whitman: May 15 - July 14



Marjorie Rubenson's pottery reflects her early training as a painter that has had a strong influence on her use of vibrant colors and texture. Since moving to this area twenty-two years ago, the source of her inspiration has been the natural beauty of San Diego County: the sea, the mountains, and the desert. Many of her clay vessels incorporate pine needles, shells and semi-precious stones - a fusion of natural materials. Her ceramics have been exhibited at the Mingei Museum and Gallery 21 in Balboa Park among other highly esteemed showplaces.

In the five years since Sue Whitman's last exhibition at the Faculty Club she has been working in a variety of mediums. She feels, "the function of an artist is to take the elements around us and transform them into imagery of form and color that will communicate to the viewer." Her response to the area landscape and variety of trees is evident in her work, which she sometimes expresses in painting, collage and wool. Her work has been shown at the America House, New York, Sherwood Square Gallery, Westport Conn. to name a couple. These two good friends feel that though their work is quite different, their thinking and approach to their art has much in common.

## Economics Roundtable Wednesday May 3, 2006



Professor George Borja's research on the economic impact of immigration is widely perceived as playing a central role in the debate over immigration policy in the United States and abroad. Both Business Week and The Wall Street Journal have called him "America's leading immigration economist." As he reveals in his latest book "Heaven's Door: Immigration Policy and the American Economy" it's decidedly mixed news for the American economy and positively bad news for the poorest citizens in that the benefits of immigration have been greatly exaggerated. If we allow immigration to continue unabated and unmodified, we are supporting an astonishing transfer of wealth from the poorest people in the country, who are disproportionately minorities, to the richest. Borjas was born in Havana, Cuba and received his Ph.D. in 1975 from Columbia University. Prior to moving to Harvard in 1995, he was professor of Economics at UCSD.
