


Manuel Rotenberg Photo Exhibit

Manuel Rotenberg is a Canadian-born physicist. He took up photography in 1955 while he was a staff member at Los Alamos National Laboratory. He left photography when he became an academic and took it up again when he retired from UCSD in 1993. The late Arthur Wagner, the founding chair of the Department of Theatre and Dance, encouraged Rotenberg to photograph actors during reheasals and performances and this has become a major activity. He also photographs most of the major dance companies throughout the city.

Candid photography, which is the main component of the present show at the UCSD Faculty Club (his third), was initiated by Henri Bresson-Cartier in 1929. He was an art student in Paris when he was handed a then-novel Leica 35 mm camera. He set the standards of street photography, or, euphemistically, urban investigative photography.



Cartier-Bresson set the rules: All compostion had to be done in the viewfinder - no postproduction cropping. Aside from enlarging, you had to take what you shot. I have strayed somewhat from his dictum but what you see on the walls of the Faculty Club have been tampered with as little as I could get away with.

Paris is probably the most photographed city on the planet. The buildings, the museums, the river, the bridges, and the light from the ever-present pale sky all make the city a painter's and photographer's dream. But this presents a problem: Almost everything you do is a cliche Of the hundreds of photos I have taken in Paris, I have selected a few that avoid the post-card views of the city.

## Oceanids - Sounding Board—Thursday, October 1, 2015

**Cheryl A. M. Anderson, PhD, MPH, MS,** Associate Professor in the Department of Family Medicine and Public Health, UC San Diego

**Title:** 2015 U.S. Dietary Guidelines: A Call for Bold Action to Create a Culture of Health

Dr. Anderson is a member of the Cardiovascular Epidemiology and Prevention Center of Excellence, as well as the Health Behavior Change in Underserved and Vulnerable Populations Center of Excellence at UCSD. Dr. Anderson received her doctoral degree from the University of Washington, and her Master of Public Health degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Dr. Anderson's research focuses on nutrition and chronic disease prevention. She is an active researcher in cardiovascular epidemiology, and is the principal investigator of an NHLBI-funded study of the effects of dietary sodium and



potassium intake on cardiovascular disease. She is the also the principal investigator of a behavioral intervention study for adherence to current dietary sodium recommendations. She is a co-investigator on the NIDDK-funded national multicenter Chronic Renal Insufficiency Cohort Study, which aims to identify risk factors and mechanisms of progressive renal disease and cardiovascular events in individuals with chronic kidney disease. Dr. Anderson is a Fellow of the American Heart Association, and is a member of the leadership committee of the American Heart Association's councils on Epidemiology and Nutrition Physical Activity and Metabolism. She is also a member of the Pan American Health Organization's (PAHO) Expert Group on Cardiovascular Disease Prevention through Dietary Salt Reduction, and the World Health Organization's International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) committee on nutrition and physical (in)activity as determinants of cancer risk in Africa. She has also served on committees of the institute of Medicine (IOM), and in 2011 was appointed to the IOM's standing Food and Nutrition Board.

Emmanuel Saez

Professor of Economics- Director, Center for Equitable Growth UC Berkeley

Emmanuel Saez is Professor of Economics and Director of the Center for Equitable Growth at the University of California Berkeley. His research focuses on tax policy and inequality both from theoretical and empirical perspectives. Jointly with Thomas Piketty, he has constructed long-run historical series of income inequality in the United States that have been widely discussed in the public debate. He received his PhD in Economics from MIT in 1999. He was awarded the John Bates Clark medal of the American Economic Association in 2009 and a MacArthur Fellowship in 2010.
